

RESPONSIVE READING: "The Lord's Supper" 1 Corinthians 11:23-3

PASTOR: For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread:

CONGREGATION: And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me.

PASTOR: After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.

CONGREGATION: For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord's death till he come.

PASTOR: Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.

CONGREGATION: But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup.

PASTOR: For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

CONGREGATION: For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.

PASTOR: For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged.

CONGREGATION: But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord, that we should not be condemned with the world.

PASTOR: Wherefore, my brethren, when ye come together to eat, tarry one for another.

ALL: And if any man hunger, let him eat at home; that ye come not together unto condemnation. And the rest will I set in order when I come.

THE CHURCH COVENANT

"And they entered into a Covenant to seek the Lord God of their Fathers with all their heart and with all their soul" Il Chronicles 15:12.

PASTOR: What common experience leads us into spiritual fellowship and covenant relations with God and one another?

CONGREGATION: Having been led, as we believe, by the Spirit of God, to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior, and on the profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, we do now, in the presence of God, Angels, and this assembly most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another, as one body in Christ.

PASTOR: By what pledge do we turn from the ways of the world?

CONGREGATION: We promise by the aid of the Holy Spirit to forsake the paths of sin, and to walk in the ways of holiness all the days of our lives.

PASTOR: What are some of our privileges and duties in this, our own Church?

CONGREGATION: With this view, we engage to strive for the advancement of this church in knowledge, holiness, and comfort; to promote its prosperity and spirituality, to sustain its worship, ordinances, discipline and doctrines.

PASTOR: What vows do we gladly make as stewards of that which God has entrusted to us?

CONGREGATION: To contribute, cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the Church, the relief of the poor, the spread of the Gospel and foster Christian Education and missions throughout all nations.

PASTOR: For the sake of our home and loved ones, what tasks do we humbly assume?

CONGREGATION: We engage to maintain family and secret devotions; to religiously educate our children; to seek the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances.

PASTOR: For the sake of the unsaved for whom Christ died, to what manner of life and conversation are we solemnly pledged?

CONGREGATION: To walk circumspectly in the world; to be just in our dealings; faithful in our engagements, and exemplary in our deportment; to avoid all tattling, backbiting, and excessive anger; to abstain from the sale and use of intoxicating liquors as a beverage and to be zealous in our efforts to advance the kingdom of our Savior.

PASTOR: Since One is our Master, even Christ and all we are brethren, by what fraternal ministries are we to strengthen each other and adorn the teachings of our Lord and Savior?

CONGREGATION: We further engage to watch over one another in brotherly love and watchfulness; giving and receiving admonition with meekness and affection; to remember each other in prayer; to aid each other in sickness and distress; to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and courtesy in speech; to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, and mindful of the rule of our Savior, to secure it without delay.

PASTOR: For the good of our own spiritual development, and for the best interest of the Master's kingdom, what do we promise to do if we move beyond the reach of this Church?

CONGREGATION: We moreover engage that when we remove from this place we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church of this faith, where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's word.

ALL: Humbly confessing our past sins, we pray for grace and strength to keep these, our holy vows, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

PASTORAL REFLECTION: KEEP YOUR GUARD UP

"Only take heed to thyself, and keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life: but teach them thy sons, and thy sons' sons. (Deuteronomy 4:9)

Read: Deuteronomy 4:1-9

A man and several friends went through a ski resort gate posted with avalanche warning signs and started snowboarding. On the second trip down, someone shouted, "Avalanche!" But the man couldn't escape and perished in the cascading snow. Some criticized him, calling him a novice. But he wasn't; he was an "avalanche certified backcountry guide." One researcher said that skiers and snowboarders with the most avalanche training are more likely to give in to faulty reasoning. "[The snowboarder died because he was lulled into letting his guard down."

As Israel prepared to go into the promised land, God wanted His people to keep their guard up—to be careful and alert. So He commanded them to obey all His "decrees and laws" (DEUTERONOMY 4:1-2) and remember His past Judgment on those who disobeyed (vv. 3-4). They needed to "be careful"; to examine themselves and keep watch over their inner lives (v.9). This would help them keep their guard up against spiritual dangers from without and spiritual apathy from within.

It's easy for us to let our guard down and fall into apathy and self-deception. But God can give us strength to avoid falling in life and forgiveness by His grace when we do. By following Him and resting in His wisdom and provision, we can keep our guard up and make good decisions!
